## Survey: FrontSteps main source of news

More than 260 owners responded to our recent survey, sharing their opinions in several areas which dealt with amenities, common area upgrades, events, retail and communications.



The results to the five questions found owners overwhelmingly were satisfied with the current offerings and/or did not want to see major changes at this time, especially those that might be costly for The Plantation.

One respondent wrote: *"Let's preserve this pristine location and keep HOA fees as low as possible. No additional costs."*

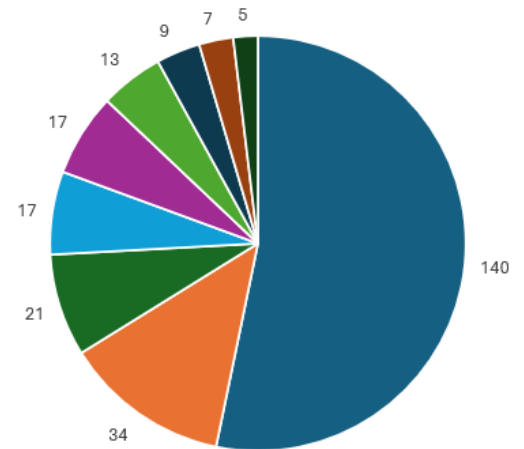
**Owners' preferred communication method** is emails through FrontSteps — 87% rely on it for events, board updates, meetings, and more, with 73% naming it their top source. The monthly newsletter (*The Plantation Post*) comes in second (59% read it), followed by the website (25%) and social media pages (15%).

One respondent suggested developing a stronger public relations strategy for communications to *"negate some of the negativity... We need to work on our image...."*

**When asked about new amenities**, with a prompt with suggestions, 53% (140) of respondents chose "none" or skipped the question. The top suggestions were food trucks or concessions at the Clubhouse or Magnolia Pool (13%), followed by a dog park (8%).

Most owners also responded “no suggestions” in answer to: **“What upgrades/additions would you like to see in the common areas?”**

37% - No upgrades

12% - Landscaping/maintenance improvements

9% - Upgrades to fitness center

Most owners responded “no suggestions,” skipped the question, or said they were satisfied with the current offerings in response to the question:

**“What kind of community events would you like to see more of within the Plantation?”**

53% - No suggestions/satisfied with what we have

8% - Casual/simple gatherings & neighborhood

5% - Events paid for by those who go

5% - Educational/Conservation events like those offered through Wednesday Wonders

Several owners said they favor more self-supporting events like BYOB and potluck, while one wrote they wanted “less Boomer events” like potluck and pickleball.

Several said they weren’t here for the parties, but the “*peace and tranquility*,” to enjoy nature and the quiet surroundings. Another owner recognized the importance of gatherings when it comes to unity. *“It’s important our community gather every few months if we want to remain a community.”*

**One question asked about retail items.** 74% said they are satisfied with the current offerings and there’s no need to add more.

Of those who did want to see more branded items, the number one answer dealt with quality. 13% wanted higher quality shirts, including golf shirts, hoodies, and zip-ups. Several want to see more variety in colors and preferred natural over synthetic fabrics. Owners also asked for branded towels, stickers, water bottles, cups and koozies.

One owner offered several ideas. *“If you make the Clubhouse more of a destination, I think people would love cute T-shirts, visors, sun hats and flipflops.”*

# Mediterranean Bean Salad

Source:  
The Recipe Well

Perfect as a side dish for the Super Bowl party, or a main meal, especially for those who meal prep. Amounts are left to the creator, and to taste.

## For the dressing you'll need

- Extra-virgin olive oil
- Lemon juice – fresh squeezed for the best flavor
- Red wine vinegar
- Dijon mustard
- Fresh garlic (or ½ tsp. garlic powder)
- Oregano
- Salt and pepper

## For the salad you'll need

- Beans – chickpeas, kidney beans and white beans. You can also substitute a premixed canned bean medley.
- Cucumber (seeds removed)
- Cherry tomatoes – sliced in half or in three.
- Bell pepper – orange, yellow or red preferred
- Kalamata olives – sliced
- Fresh parsley
- Red onion – diced small
- Fresh basil – 20 medium-sized leaves
- Feta cheese – optional



***This salad is packed with protein.***

## Instructions:

- Step 1: Whisk all dressing ingredients together. Set aside.
- Step 2: Combine beans, vegetables and herbs. Gently mix with soft spatular.
- Step 3: Add the dressing, mixing gently to coat.
- Step 4: Fold in the feta cheese.
- Step 5: Cover and refrigerate for two hours to allow the flavors to blend.

## Tip:

- Rinse beans and drain well.
