Sea turtle activities

Born on March 13, 2026, the St. George Island Sea Turtle Patrol, Inc. was created after discovering that St. George Island falls outside the boundaries of the Apalachicola National Estuarine Research Reserve (ANERR). What initially seemed like a challenge quickly became an incredible opportunity to grow, strengthen our mission, and make an even greater impact for sea turtle conservation on St. George Island.

As an independent nonprofit operating under my FWC Marine Turtle Permit MTP-143, our volunteers work tirelessly to protect nesting sea turtles and their hatchlings while educating residents and visitors about the importance of preserving these remarkable animals.

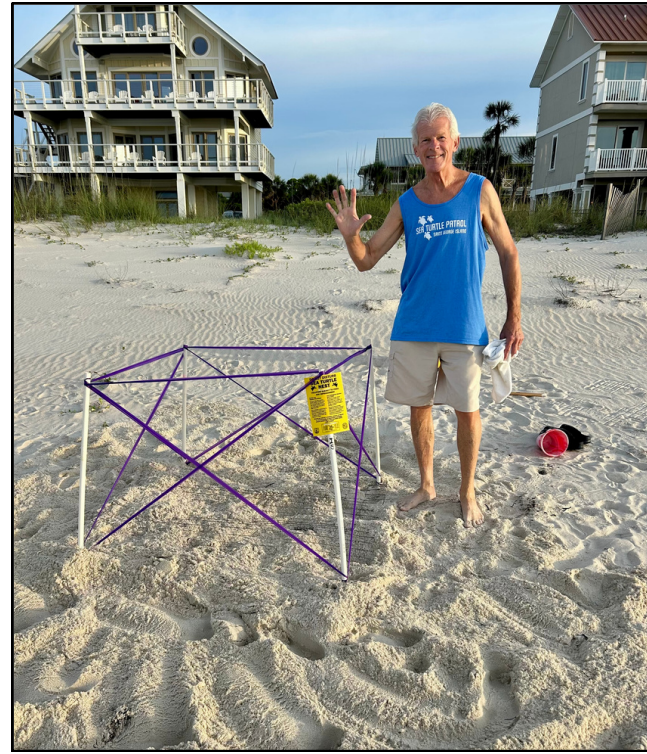
One of our most exciting initiatives is our partnership with Franklin County Elementary School. Together, we launched a year-long problem-based learning program focused on sea turtles, conservation, and marine science. Students are actively engaged in learning about sea turtle biology, habitat protection, and the challenges these endangered species face.

As part of this groundbreaking educational effort, the students selected the name for one of 10 sea turtles that

As we share staff accomplishments for the past few weeks, we have selected both ongoing projects as well as special projects and more in the works. Over the last few weeks:

- Security handled upwards of 600 vehicles through the gate (every) Saturday afternoon.
- The ARC support group handled 8 requests, with 5 approved, 1 tabled, and 2 denied in May.
- Staff assisted with the successful launch of 1st Thursday Food Truck, presented by ArtSocial.
- Staff issued 32 new RFIDs during the month.
- Maintenance shifted into summer with ongoing mowing, weed eating and trimming of 88 miles of road edge, 31 boardwalks, 3 bridges, 30 nature trails and 8.5 miles of bike paths.
- A total of 29 SGP e-mail blasts were sent out for the month of May; gained 37 followers on Facebook page and 12 on Instagram.
- Behind-the-scenes weekly accounts payables, receivables and assessments by Finance Director.
- Continued working on a plan to upgrade the fitness center.
- Reviewed and updated our Hurricane Preparedness Plan.
- Received the final Reserve Study plan on our Plantation assets which will be shared in the June 11 FinCom meeting.
- Shared and posted Double Red Flag and turtle information as needed.
- Welcomed more than a dozen canines (and their owners) into the Plantation offices!

Flag Day is June 14

The “Stars and Stripes” was adopted by the Continental Congress as the official American flag on June 14, 1777, during the Revolutionary War. Colonial troops fought under many different flags with various symbols – rattlesnakes, pine trees, and eagles – and slogans – “Don’t Tread on Me,” “Liberty or Death,” and “Conquer or Die,” to name a few. The Declaration of Independence made the adoption of an American flag necessary. President Woodrow Wilson made the observance official on May 30, 1916.

Mojito Fruit Salad

Prep time: 20 minutes Sitting: 1 hour
Servings: 6 Calories: 83

Ingredients:

- 1 cup cubed seeded watermelon
- 1 cup seedless grapes
- 1 cup cubed cantaloupe
- 1 cup quartered strawberries
- 1 cup peeled and quartered kiwi
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 3 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- 2 teaspoons white sugar
- 3 sprigs fresh mint
- Optional: ¼ cup white rum, coconut rum or fruit-infused vodka or gin



Preparation:

1. Combine watermelon, grapes, cantaloupe, strawberries, and kiwi in a large bowl with a tight-fitting lid; top with blueberries.
2. Combine lime juice, sugar, and mint in a small bowl, crushing mint with the back of a spoon to extract flavors; pour over fruit mixture. Add alcohol if you choose. Seal the bowl with the lid. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour.
3. Gently flip sealed bowl several times to coat fruit with lime juice mixture just before serving.

hurricane season for 2026. Please go to the St. George Plantation website and review the section called Live – then go to Disaster Preparation. We encourage everyone to review their preparedness plans, secure outdoor items, and stay informed of weather conditions throughout the season. The HOA will monitor weather conditions and take steps to help ensure the safety and resilience of our community. As we enter hurricane season, please remain vigilant and take appropriate precautions to protect your property and family. Here's a few tips:

- Have a clear plan – Know evacuation routes.
- Gather essential supplies – Stock at least three days' worth of non-perishable food, water, medicine, flashlights, batteries, and a battery-powered radio, plus pet supplies if applicable.
- Understand the difference between a watch and a warning – A watch means hurricane conditions are possible; a warning means they are expected soon. Act immediately if you receive a warning.
- Prepare for extended outages – Anticipate that power, water, and internet may be unavailable for days or weeks, and have backup power sources and cash on hand.
- Stay informed and connected. Updates are available from the [National Hurricane Center](#).

Our community is strongest when neighbors support one another and work toward shared goals. Thank you for your continued commitment to making our neighborhood a welcoming and enjoyable place to call home. Wishing everyone peace, harmony, and many pleasant days ahead.
